TERM TIME HOLIDAYS

So far this academic year 2018/2019 children across Years 7 -13 have been out of school for a total of 9,156 days (4.3%) which equates to 7 days per child. We appreciate this is not 4 days per individual, BUT WE STILL NEED TO CHANGE THIS STATISTIC! Reasons for the absences are made up of sickness, medical appointments, and time off to attend religious ceremonies or family events.

Family Term Time Leave - in line with the School and Borough Policies - is rarely authorised unless exceptional circumstances exist and are made in writing. All parents will be need to meet with the Deputy Headteacher in advance to discuss requests. Your children only attend school for 190 days (380 sessions) out of 365. This leaves 175 days for school holidays.

LATENESS

Did you know that being late 10/15 minutes each day is the same as missing two weeks of school over the year. Lateness is just as serious as non-attendance. The start of the school days is an important time for students to develop their social skills with their peers, as well as preparing them for learning. We start teaching at 08:30 and 'late' children can miss out on vital skills such basic numeracy and literacy work.

DID YOU KNOW....?

FOR EVERYDAY OF SCHOOL MISSED - ATTENANCE WILL REDUCE BY 0.5%

10 WHOLE DAYS OF SCHOOL HAS BEEN MISSED IF YOUR CHILD HAS 95% ATTENDANCE

20 DAYS OF SCHOOL HAS BEEN MISSED IS STUDENTS ATTENDANCE IS 90%

BY THE TIME A STUDENT IS PERSISTENTLY ABSENT (90%) THEY WILL HAVE MISSED 6 WEEKS OR HALF A TERM OF SCHOOLING
